SUN PRAIRIE UTILITIES

PROJECT BACKGROUND

Sun Prairie Utilities (SPU) is a not-for-profit, locally owned municipal electric and water utility serving Sun Prairie, Wisconsin. Rapid community growth—tripling in population over the past 50 years—prompted SPU to build a new facility to better serve its 39,419 residents. The two-story, 82,250-square-foot office and warehouse replaces a 50-year-old, 19,000-square-foot facility and offsite storage. Designed through an integrative process, the building centralizes services, enhances security, improves energy efficiency, and supports reliable operations for the next 30-50 years. The facility includes expanded vehicle maintenance and storage, modern workspaces, and an improved customer experience with a drive-up window and after-hours drop box. Office spaces feature customer service areas, community meeting rooms, training spaces, and employee wellness amenities. The landscaped site includes bike storage, EV charging, and outdoor employee areas, demonstrating SPU's commitment to sustainability, innovation, and community well-being.

STRATEGIES AND RESULTS

Seeking LEED v4 BD+C Gold certification, SPU aimed to demonstrate accountability to customers while leveraging Wisconsin's Focus on Energy incentives and the IRA tax credit to offset initial facility costs. The project's primary goals were to create a high-performing, all-electric, energy-efficient building with renewable energy to minimize environmental impact and operational costs, and to provide a healthy, comfortable space with natural daylight, nature views, and high indoor air quality. Located on a previously developed site, the design preserved wetlands, restored native vegetation, reduced parking, minimized paved areas and light pollution, and supported walkability and alternative transportation.

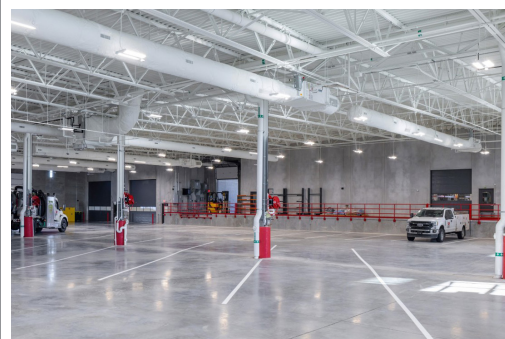
The high-efficiency geothermal system and LED lighting systems are controlled by occupancy sensors to reduce energy use, lowering energy costs 58% below the baseline, cutting carbon emissions by 50%. The 435 kW PV system generates 538,600 kWh of electricity, producing approximately 70.2% of the electricity, saving SPU thousands of dollars annually. Seven meters monitor energy use across systems for continuous improvement. To ensure the systems and equipment perform optimally, the building envelope and all on-site energy-consuming mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems, as well as the PV system, were commissioned. The low-flow plumbing fixtures have contributed to an estimated annual savings of over 36%. Six water submeters were installed to track usage and detect anomalies for proactive maintenance.

To maintain a high level of indoor air quality, a construction indoor air quality management plan was implemented, MERV 13 filtration media is used in the ventilation system to capture particulates, and the materials used inside the facility are low- or zero-VOC. A sound construction waste management plan resulted in 76.49% of waste diverted from the landfill, which was no easy feat considering the existing building was deconstructed.
